 - C Science of Sharks**
Get up close to some small but mighty shark species and discover their remarkable adaptations in this new exhibit. Opens at 9:30 a.m.
 - D African Penguins**
Watch these charming birds preen and play.
 - E Blue Planet Action Center**
Learn about challenges facing the blue planet and the Aquarium's leading role in ocean conservation.
 - F New Balance Foundation Marine Mammal Center**
Get up close to the northern fur seals and California sea lions.
 - G Rockhopper Penguins**
See the penguins with the yellow crests.
 - H Tropical Gallery**
See colorful clownfish, lionfish, and live coral.

Visit the smallest penguins in the world.
